 - Novice & PW Reel: Each dancer performs the right and left foot of the reel step, down the line, one at a time
 - Novice & PW Treble Jig: Each dancer performs the right and left foot of the treble jig step, down the line, one at a time
 - Beg, Adv. Beg, Novice, & PW Adult Reel Special: Each dancer performs the right and left foot of the reel step, down the line, one at a time
 - Champ Treble Reels: Each dancer performs right and left foot of the treble reel, down the line, one at a time

Competition Rules

1. Rules adopted by the Western US Region of IDTANA, member CLRG, are included by reference.
2. Rules and requirements for each competition as noted in the syllabus are included by reference.
3. Competitors must be in the hall prepared to dance one hour prior to the scheduled start of their event.
4. Competitions with fewer than five entrants may be combined or canceled by the Feis Committee; the Feis Committee may add or combine competitions at its discretion.
5. Competitors must be in costume, including soft shoes, to receive awards presented on stage.
6. All local health restrictions in place at the time of competition will be strictly adhered to.
7. In the event that the competition is canceled by the Committee due to local health restrictions, dancers will be refunded the value of their entry less a \$10 processing fee.
8. Haran School of Irish Dance, Feis at the Falls LLC, and anyone associated in producing the feis, including feis volunteers, shall not be held responsible or liable for any personal injury, property loss, or damage.
9. Entry constitutes acceptance of the rules and restrictions outlined herein.

Deirdre Abeid Memorial Feis - Blackout Costume Guidelines

1. We highly encourage all dancers to wear black out attire to honor our school founder Deirdre Abeid. She was a major advocate of all dancers being judged on their own merit. She loved the beauty of Irish dance without the distraction of accessories.
2. Suggested attire for girls/ladies is a skirt or skort; boys/gents may wear long pants. Black tights are encouraged for girls/ladies.
3. Either long or short-sleeve shirts; boys/gents encouraged to not wear ties, vests or jackets.
4. Girls/ladies hair should be pulled back neatly from the face; we encourage no wigs, crowns, tiaras or hairpieces. Light or no make-up is encouraged, with stud earrings only.
5. All costuming must conform to the costume requirements set forth by CLRG.
6. Branded attire (i.e. Nike, Adidas, etc.) should be small and discreet.
7. No "bling" is encouraged on any part of the costume (i.e. skirts, pants, tops, buckles, etc.).

LEVEL DEFINITIONS AND ADVANCEMENT RULES

First Feis is not per dance. It is the first Feis ever for the dancer. Dancers may only enter First Feis once, regardless of how many dances they are competing, even in the case of back-to-back Feiseanna.

In **Beginner 1, Beginner 2 and Novice** the following advancement rules will apply:

- Competitions with 5 - 9 dancers: 1st place will advance to the next grade.
- Competitions with 10 or more dancers: 1st and 2nd places will advance to the next grade.
- Dancers may not stay in level at teacher discretion, with the exception of back-to-back feiseanna.

Prizewinner: Advancement from Prizewinner to Preliminary Championship is at teacher discretion.

Preliminary to Open Championship:

- Dancer must have 3 overall wins in competitions with 5 or more dancers. Advancement to Open is not at teacher discretion.
- Upon winning 3rd overall win in Preliminary Championships, a dancer must move immediately to Open, even in the case of back-to-back Feiseanna. This includes 2-round and 3-round Preliminary Championships.

Adults: Dancers who started after the age of 18, or who have been out of Youth/&over competition for 5 years.

Advanced Adults: Dancers age 18 or older who previously placed in the top 3 of a Preliminary Championship or competed at the Open Championship level in the youth/&over levels, regardless of when the competitor was last active.

- Advanced Adults do not need to be out of competition for 5 years before moving from the youth/&over categories to Advanced Adults.
- Dancers who have already been competing in the regular Adult categories do not need to move to Advanced Adults, regardless of their level or placements achieved when competing in youth/&over.
- An Advanced Adult dancer has opted to leave Youth/&over categories, and once the dancer begins competing in Advanced Adult, the dancer may not return to Youth/&over categories.

Beginner Figures: Open only to dancers in beginner for at least one solo dance.

Open Figures: Open to all grade levels.
