Dancers may **NOT** dance twice in the same competition.

- 1. Team members should be in the correct age wherever possible. 50% do not have to be of the age. Please do not split teams to make two teams in the same competition. Competitor names and ages will be reviewed.
- 2.25% may repeat from age below to complete team.
- 3. Girls may compete in both girls and mixed teams in the same age group.
- 4. Mixed ceili teams must have at least 2 boys. Boys must be in top positions.
- 5. Top couples will have backs to adjudicators.
- 6. Requirement: Lead, body, completion of the 1st figure by top couple(s) except in the following:

Sweets of May - Beginning up to and including the See Saw.

Three Tunes - Beginning up to and including the Hook & Chain

Gates of Derry - Beginning up to and including the swing around of the 1st repeat.

Lannigan's Ball - Complete dance

#### Figure Choreography Requirements:

Each team will consist of 8-16 dancers.

Dances must be in 2/4, 4/4, or 6/8 time or a combination of those times.

Please note: Any change of music must last for at least 16 bars. Teams must supply their own music. Time limit is 4 minutes from start of music to end of dance. Walk off may be additional music.

#### **Dance Drama Requirements:**

Each team will consist of 8-20 dancers

Set up and take down - 5 minutes each

Dance length - minimum 4 minutes, maximum 6 minutes.

## FEISWORX.COM (Teachers only)

ENTRIES: Open September 1st

Close October 1st. Entries close, changes accepted until October 8th.

Close late entry October 8th. Registration closed, no further changes.

Please ensure your Adult dancers are in the correct age groups, it will not be possible to swap dancers at the event.

## RULES

Entry deadline: October 1st, 2025 -late entry October 8th,2025.

Entries will be accepted online via feisworx.com, starting September 1st, 2025, from teachers who are members in good standing with CLRG, IDTANA and the WUSR.

Individual submissions from parents or dancers will not be accepted.

A family registration fee of \$50 will be added to entry. Teachers who are currently registered with An Coimisiun le Rinci Gaelacha, plus their National and Regional bodies are exempt from this fee when registering their own children.

A family is defined as all members who reside in the same household.

There will be no late entries or changes accepted after the deadline, no exceptions will be made.

The W.U.S.R. reserves the right to refuse any entry for any reason.

Payment is by credit card, and there will be an applicable credit card processing fee added to your entry.

Age: A competitors age is determined as of January 1st, 2025

**Adult Solo Championships**: This event is open to dancers aged 18 & over, who have not competed during the previous five years, except as an adult dancer. Dancers who availed of the one time transfer from Juvenile competitions to Adult competitions are exempt from this rule provided the move was recorded with the region (does not apply to Advanced Adults).

**Advanced Adults**: An Advanced Adult dancer is defined as anyone age 18 or older who has previously placed in the top 3 of a PreliminaryChampionship or competed at the Open Championship level in the youth/&over levels, regardless of when the competitor was last active.

- Advanced Adults do not need to be out of competition for 5 years before moving from the youth/&over categories to Advanced Adults.
- Dancers who have already been competing in the regular Adult categories do not need to move to Advanced Adults, regardless of their level or placements achieved when competing in youth/&over.
- An Advanced Adult dancer has opted to leave Youth/&over categories, and once the dancer begins competing in Advanced Adult, the dancer may not return to Youth/&over categories.

#### Dances:

All solo championships (including Adult) will commence with the hard shoe round, followed by the soft shoe round. Please see the competition listing for the required dances per age group. For the U8-U14, the hard shoe round will be danced 3 at a time. In all other age groups, the hard shoe will be performed 2 at a time. For all age groups, the soft shoe round will be performed 2 at a time.

Solo championship dancers are not eligible to dance in trad set competitions, this includes Adults.

Dancers who are recalled to perform a set dance must choose from the CLRG Official list, with the exceptions of U10 dancers who must perform a 6/8 or 9/8 tempo set dance, U8/U9/Adult dancers must perform a traditional set dance. All set dances will be performed 1 at a time.

#### Speeds:

Speeds for all dances in Solo championships (including Adult) will be in accordance with current CLRG directives. Metronomes will be used at each stage. Dancers MAY NOT supply their own Metronome.

Reel-113, Slip Jig-113

Treble Jig-73, Hornpipe-113

St. Patricks Day-94, Blackbird-144, Job of Journey Work-138, Garden Of Daisies- 138, Jockey to the Fair-90,

Three Sea Captains-96, King of the Fairies-130.

Ceili-115 (Teachers may choose a different speed at check in).

#### Music:

Official Musicians will play for all solo and ceili events. It is expected that each figure (and dance drama) team will supply its own music by way of live or pre-recorded means, along with someone (not including a teacher) to operate an iPad (or similar device) if needed. Each stage will be equipped with an 1/8 jack connection wire.

16 bars of music will be played by the official musicians prior to the commencement of each of the first two rounds of every solo championship.

Musicians will play an 8-bar introduction, followed by 40 bars of music for Hornpipes and Slip jigs, and an 8 bar introduction, followed by 48 bars of music for Treble jigs and Reels.

Set dances will be played with the step introduction, followed by the right and left foot of the step plus the set part of the music (on the right foot only). Dancers will not be permitted to dance beyond these descriptions.

#### **Traditional Set:**

Traditional set competitions will be offered to dancers who are not entered in solo championship competitions. Rules for entry are as follows: Dancers may not enter solo championships and traditional set competitions. Traditional set dancers may also perform in the WUSR Mini Feis

#### Teams:

Dancers in team competitions may compete in their own age groups, or a higher age group, but may not compete in an age group lower than their actual age (except for Adult Ceili who use the average age to determine the age group). Female dancers may compete in both Girls/Ladies and Mixed team competitions in the same age group. Mixed Ceili competitions must consist of at least 2 male dancers, while Mixed figure competitions consist of at least 1 male dancer.

At least 50% of the dancers in each team must compete in their proper age group.

#### Ceili:

Teams may perform any 8-hand dance from the CLRG official list. All teams must dance with the top couple's backs to the adjudicators. All dances must be performed through the completion of a figure of choice, unless otherwise specified. All ceili dances must be danced in accordance with the requirements of the 2023 syllabus for Oireachtas Rince na Cruinne, as published by CLRG. But only in terms of duration and conclusion of the dance.

Mixed Teams must have 2 boys and they must dance in the top positions (WUSR 2015).

#### 4 & 6 hands:

This year's 4-hand will be 4 Hand Reel, First figure.

This year's 6-hand will be The Fairy Reel, and must be danced through advance, retire and pass through.

All 4 hands dance the same dance and figure, regardless of age groups (WUSR 2019).

All 6 hands dance the same dance and figure, regardless of age groups (WUSR 2024).

All 4 hand teams must dance with the top couple standing to the left, from the adjudicators view.

All 6 hand dances must dance with Line 1 on the adjudicators left, facing line 2.

Mixed 4 -hands must consist of at least 1 boy. Dancers on a 4-hand team may not repeat on another 4-hand team. Girls who participate in girls 4-hands may not participate in mixed 4-hand competitions.

Mixed 6 hand teams must consist of at least 1 boy. Dancers on a 6 hand team may not repeat on another 6-hand team. Girls who participate in girls 6-Hands may not participate in mixed 6-hand competitions.

4 Hand Reel speed-115 The Fairy Reel speed - 115

#### **Collegiate 4-hands**

These 4 hands are exclusive to colleges within the Western region and consist of dancers who are current students of that college. Teams may include one male dancer, but no more than 50% can be male. This competition is open without restrictions on judging or dance school affiliations. Dancers may still compete in both solo and team events for their respective dance schools in their regions. Dances and speeds will follow our current 4 hand rotation

\*\*Please note, one team member will pay the \$60 team entry fee. Dancers will enter through Feisworx via the Mini Feis.

#### Figure Choreography:

Teams must follow the parameters as laid out in the 2025 syllabus for Oireachtas rince na Cruinne, as published by CLRG, with 2 exceptions: a Mixed team only requires 1 male dancer, and no more than 50% of the female dancers in a Mixed team may be repeated from a Girls/Ladies team.

#### Dance Drama:

Teams must follow the parameters as laid out in the 2025 syllabus for Oireachtas Rince na Cruinne, as published by CLRG. There will be an allotment of 15 minutes per team from start to finish, which includes setup, reading of the story, performance, and dismantling of set.

Stories: Narratives for Figure and Dance Drama events must be typed, and 6 copies must be submitted no later than 1 hour prior to the published start time of the competition. Teams may use their own narrator to read their story, however, this individual may not be a teacher from the participating school, nor may they appear in clothing which identifies the school.

#### Check in:

Dancers must be checked in before the competition starts. Dancers who fail to check in prior to the start of the competition will be disqualified. (Late arrivals will not be permitted to compete).

Dancers will collect their numbers during the check in process.

#### **Competitor Numbering System**

There will be one number per competitor for all three rounds. Numbers will be unpublished and randomized.

#### Recalls:

When the first two rounds are complete, the extended Irish points system will be used to rank the competitors in order of merit. 50% of the participants will be recalled to perform a set dance in all competitions of 21 or more dancers. For competitions with 20 or fewer dancers, all participants will be recalled.

A dancer who does not complete the first two rounds, can not be recalled to dance the third round.

Any dancer who does not complete the third round of a competition will automatically receive ZERO marks for that round and will only be eligible to feature in the award ceremony as a recalled dancer. Any points allotted to that dancer from the first two rounds will remain with that dancer.

#### **AWARDS**:

#### Solo

All solo dancers shall receive a participation item, and all recalled dancers in Solo Championships (including Adult) shall receive an official WUSR Oireachtas medal.

First place winner in all solo championships will receive a perpetual award, which requires signing of a release form by a (Parent/ Guardian or Dancers, if aged 18 & over).

It is not mandatory to sign the form, however, if the form is not signed then the award will not be issued.

#### Teams:

All U8 & U10 teams, girls and mixed will receive an award.

In ceili competitions, aged U12 and older, where there are 5 or less teams, 100% will place. If there are 6 or more teams 50% will place.

In all figure choreography comps, all teams receive awards.

#### **Qualification for Worlds 2026:**

Qualifiers will be assessed and announced, based on the number of dancers who actually dance, applying the current CLRG formulas.

Adult solo Championships do not qualify for the World Championships.

#### Judging System:

Judges will convene at a designated time and stage for a public draw of their team color assignments. The time and location of this draw will be posted in the program.

Judges are not permitted to have on their possession, any cellular devices.

Judges are only informed of what competitions they're judging as they walk into the ballroom, 5 mins prior to published competition start time.

#### **Solo Championships**

There will be rotating panels of 5 adjudicators for each solo Championship round, with the high and low score dropped from each round.

#### **Team Event**

There will be 5 adjudicators in total for each Team event, with a high and low score dropped.

#### **Trad Set Competitions**

There will be 5 adjudicators in total for each Traditional set competition, with a high and low score dropped.

Where an adjudicator deems that a dancer failed to complete their performance in any given round, that dancer must receive a ZERO marks by each adjudicator in that round.

#### MISHAPS:

Adjudicators will be instructed to ring the bell to stop the performances when the health and/or safety of a dancer (in solo or team events) is at risk, due to collision with another dancer, injury or falling, and adjudicators will be instructed to use their best judgement in the case of open laces, shoes falling off or issue with costumes/ accessories. Should a dancer lose a heel or an entire shoe, they may stand at the back to allow the other dancer(s) to complete their performance, and will be permitted to re-dance without penalty when deemed practical by the Stage Manager.

Should, at the opinion of the Stage Manager, the hosting committee, a medical professional and/or the adjudicators, a dancer be deemed unfit to re-dance, and a dancer/parent insists on doing so, a waiver exonerating the WUSR Inc, the WUSR board and co-chairs from any and all liability must be completed and signed by the legal parent and/or guardian of the dancer (if under the age of 18) before the dancer may re-dance. Any repeat incident which results in the dancer being unable to complete the number of bars of that dance will result in the dancer having to withdraw from the competition.

Dancers stopped by the adjudicators by way of ringing of the bell due to a mishap in the last 8 bars of any performance shall only be required to perform the last 16 bars of that dance; otherwise, the full dance must be performed. Where feasible, the dancers will be brought back to re-dance no sooner than 3 rotations later, and no later than five rotations later. Dancers so affected by the bell being rung and permitted to re-dance will be marked at the discretion of each adjudicator.

A dancer who exits the stage during a performance, unless instructed to do so by an adjudicator, will receive ZERO marks for that particular round by each adjudicator.

#### SIDE STAGE/FRONT ROW AREA:

Front row is for teachers only, teachers children and families are not permitted to be in the front row.

Teachers and dancers wearing clothing depicting their school's name will not be allowed side-stage to interact with competitors once they are in line to compete and /or to greet dancers at the other side of the stage after their performance, if they are within the line of sight of the adjudicators.

#### FILMING/RECORDING:

Use of video recorders, movie cameras, camcorders and/or any camera/cell phone that is capable of taking videos will not be permitted during competitions, except for news media as approved by the hosting committee of the event. Further, no flash photography will be permitted during competitions, other than by the official photographer and live streaming service provider (if applicable). Please note that by submitting an entry to the event, all entrants acknowledge their agreement to abide by the live streaming rules for the event, and thereby remove WUSR Inc, WUSR board and WUSR Oireachtas Co-chairs from any liability associated with the same.

#### **APPEALS**:

Legitimate complaints must be submitted to the WUSR Oireachtas committee in writing and signed within one hour of the alleged incident, by a CLRG-registered individual. Such complaints must cite the specific rule(s) in dispute, a brief summary of the incident, and be accompanied by a USD \$150 cash fee. If the appeal is upheld, the fee will be returned.

#### **DECISIONS**:

All decisions made by the WUSR Oireachtas committee and/or the Adjudicators, in accordance with the rules for this event and all WUSR rules, will be final.

#### **FACILITY USAGE POLICY:**

To gain entry to the WUSR Oireachtas venue, all attendees must wear a facility wristband. Wristbands are provided to those who book accommodations through the official WUSR hotel blocks.

Wristbands are required for all attendees traveling from outside a 100-mile radius of the Spokane Convention Center. Dancers and families who choose to stay outside of the hotel block may purchase a wristband for \$100 (this covers the full weekend) through the WUSR website under the Oireachtas page. The wristband policy will be strictly enforced throughout the weekend.

*Please note*: Any individuals who falsely claim non-receipt of wristbands in order to reverse payment through their bank will be prohibited from attending future WUSR Oireachtasí.

#### Why We Require Hotel Block Participation

Hosting an event of this scale costs significantly more than what dancer entry fees alone can support. By partnering with hotels through block agreements, we are able to secure vital benefits such as ballroom space, competition stages, meals and rooms for Adjudicators and Musicians—without dramatically raising entry fees. Without these hotel partnerships, entry costs would need to be approximately triple their current rates to cover all expenses.
